

You should dress professionally for your interview. This means wearing a suit or dress slacks and a button-down shirt. You should also make sure your shoes are clean and polished.


Be Yourself

After your interview, be sure to send a thank-you note to the interviewers. This will show them that you were interested in the opportunity and that you appreciate their time.


