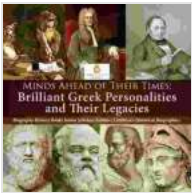

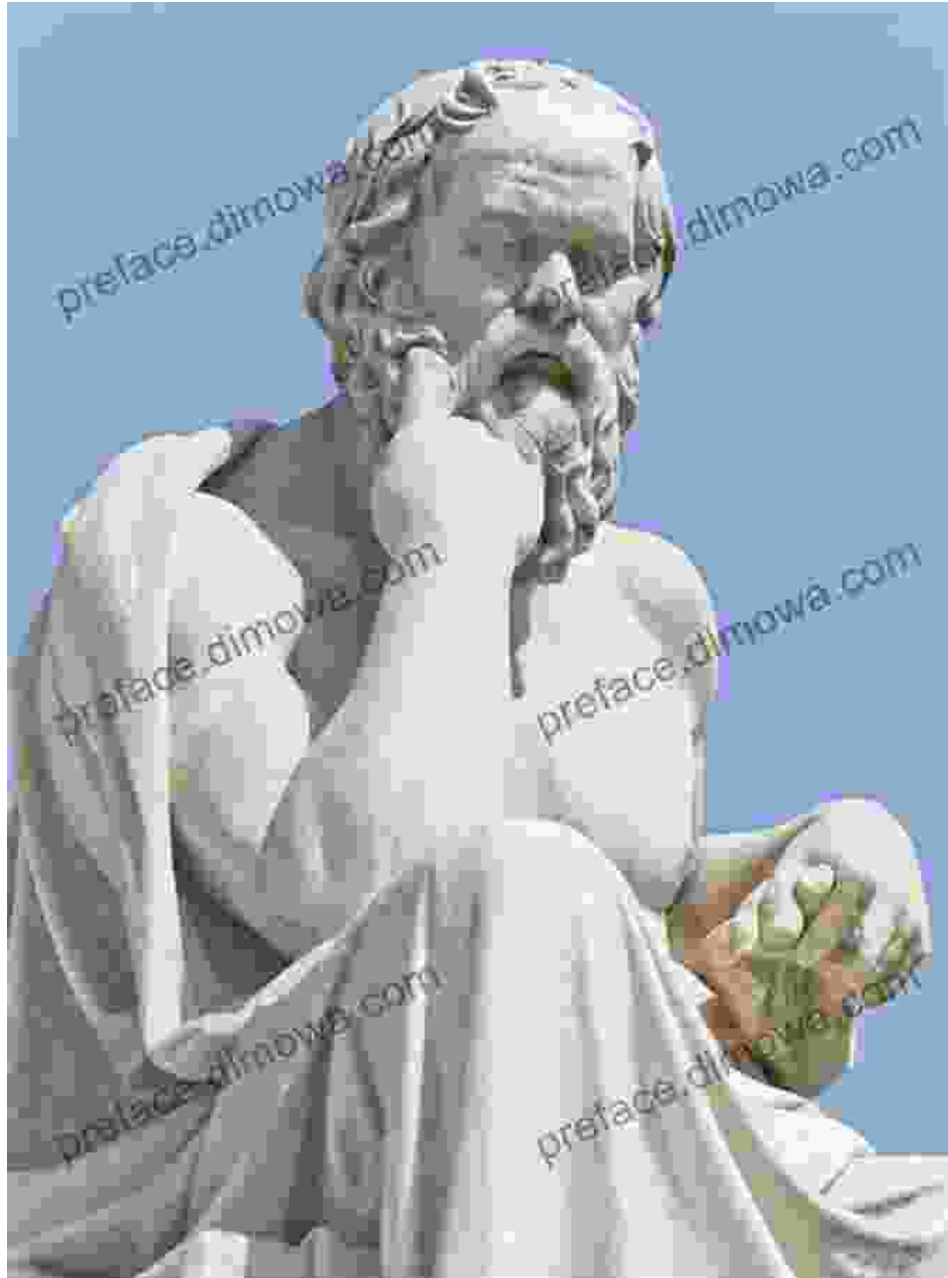

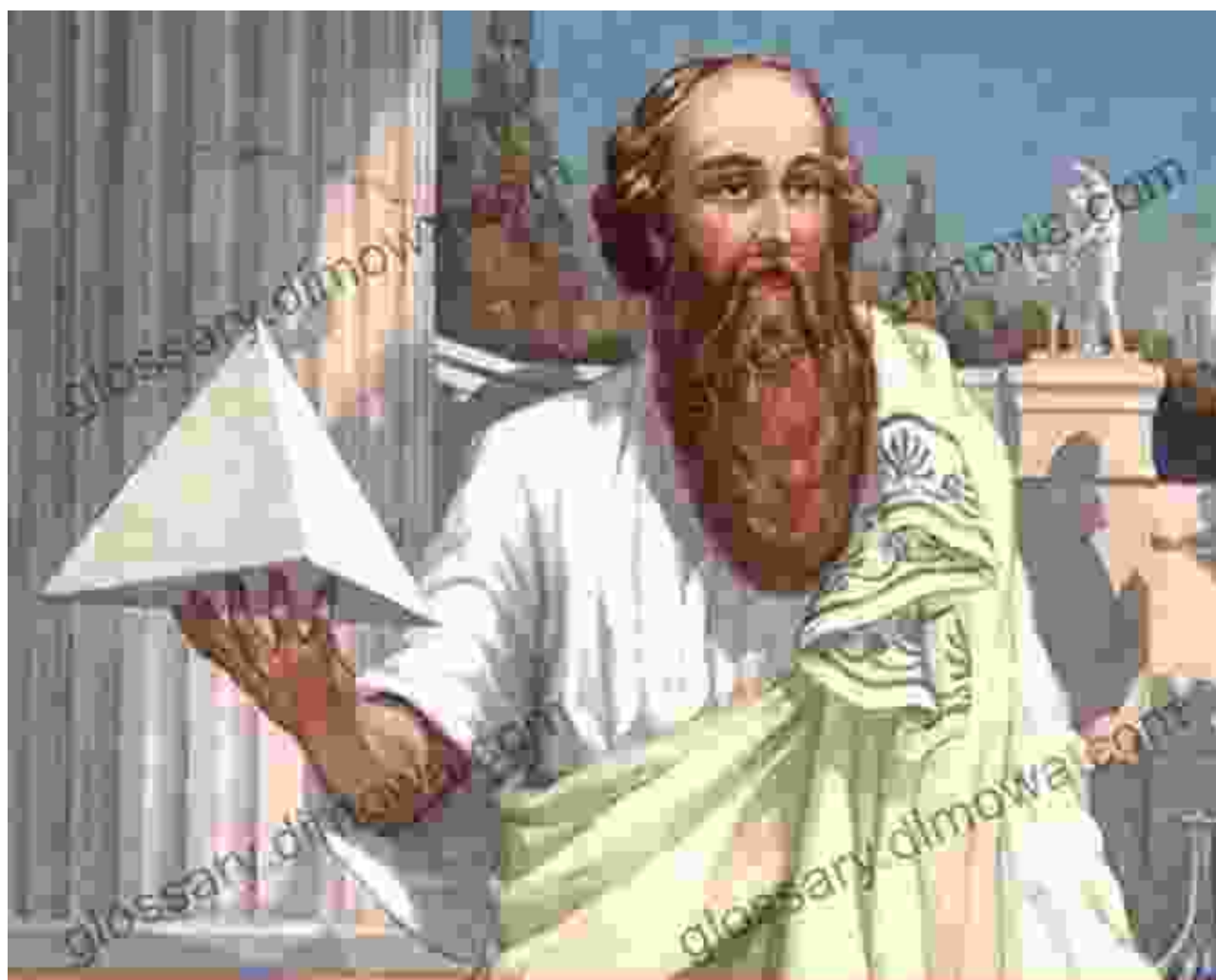

Archimedes

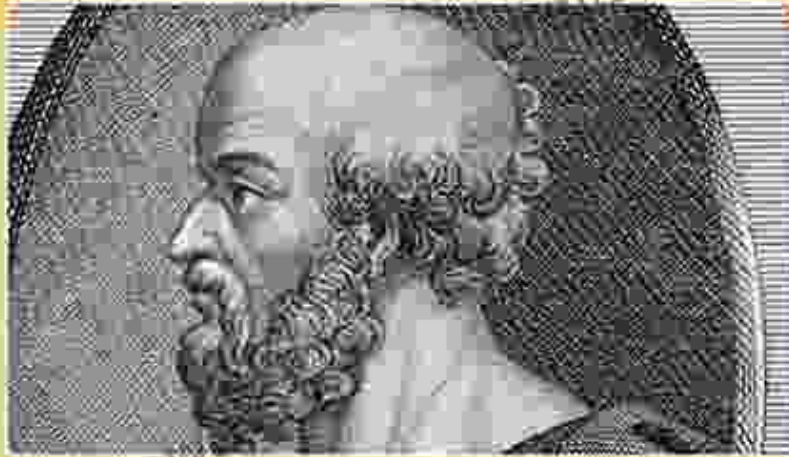

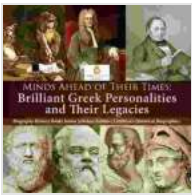

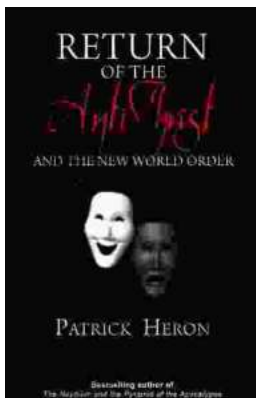
