## **Shelter**

\* A tent or tarp \* A sleeping bag \* A sleeping pad

## **First aid supplies**

\* A first aid kit \* Antiseptic wipes \* Bandages \* Pain relievers

## **Fire starter**

\* Matches or a lighter \* Fire starter tinder \* A fire starter

## **Flashlight**

\* A flashlight with extra batteries \* A headlamp

## **Multi-tool**

\* A multi-tool with pliers, a knife, a saw, and other tools

## **Whistle**

\* A whistle to signal



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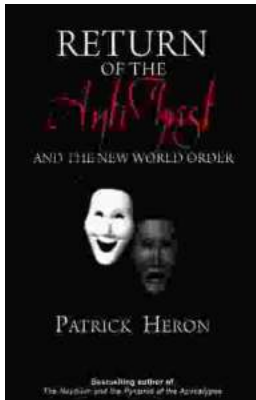
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
